Conference Overview

Pediatric emergency medicine (PEM) is a relatively new subspecialty which has a unique scope of practice and, therefore, unique educational needs. The subspecialty encompasses portions of general pediatric and subspecialty medical/surgical disciplines, as well as many acute care skills. Our focus is on the triage, evaluation, and management of the ill and injured child.

Target Audience

Physicians and healthcare professionals in the specialty areas of Emergency Medicine, Pediatrics, and Family Practice.

Objectives

At the conclusion of the activity, the participant should be able to:

1. Discuss the triage, evaluation, and management of a variety of pediatric emergency medicine issues – infectious disease, genitourinary/renal emergencies, childhood sexual abuse, seizures, dermatological conditions, cardiac dysrhythmias, sports injuries, difficult airways, and renal emergencies.
2. Discuss the ethical challenges facing the emergency physician and nurse.
3. Describe the use of conscious sedation when treating children undergoing painful as well as radiologic procedures.
4. Analyze and discuss common medical controversies confronting physicians and nurses who treat children.
